DOAS quality as a public good

- Desk work and co-creation with the community.
- Based on the Extensible Quality Standard in Institutional Publishing (EQSIP v1 and EQSIP v2) from DIAMAS EU funded project.



- An IPSP Best Practices report to analise 71 documents
- **EQSIP v1**: selecting relevant standards & best practices
- A gap analysis testing previous results
- EQSIP v2
- Focus groups from various scholarly disciplines, regions, and languages that provided analysis & feedback
- An open consultation to qualified individuals from more than 10 countries
- Contributions from the publishing community enriched it, ensuring active participation in cocreation of **DOAS**

- Based on 7 core components outlined in the Action Plan for Diamond Open Access, revised and refined by the DIAMAS project team.
- Focused on journals.
- A comprehensive approach to maintaining high standards in scholarly publishing.

How to use DOAS

- 100 ITEMS
 - **53 REQUIRED** items ensuring fundamental practices.
 - 47 DESIRED items offering additional recommendations.
- Essential compliance and aspirational goals for Diamond OA scholarly publishers.



- Serves as the Diamond OA Standard for scholarly publishers
- Represents a *measure of quality* and a point of reference for comparison
- Helps to ensure quality and transparency in governance, processes, and workflows of journals' publishing activities
- Outlines required and desired items for compliance
- Emphasises clarity and transparency,
 prioritising openness in information
 dissemination



How to use DOAS

Self-assessment Tool

The seven core components of the DOAS are structured linearly, each with its own subcomponents and defining elements.

These elements (100 in total) make up the **Self-assessment Tool**, which enables users to assess their adherence to the quality standard through compliance-related questions.

REGISTER

To take the self-assessment test you must be registered on the platform. To register, press the top "ENTER" button and then click on "REGISTER NOW" to create your account.





LOGIN

To enter, click on the top button "ENTER" and enter your username and password, if you are not registered, click on "REGISTER NOW" and create your account.

CHOOSE MODULE

The platform has two modules to complete the self-assessment test, DOAS and Sustainability. You can complete one or both tests.





AUTOEVALUATE

When you select one of the modules, a quiz will appear. Answer the questions until you complete it. When you're done, click the "FINISH" button to finish the test and send it to your email.



When you finish the test, you will receive a full report with the results in your email. Remember, you can take it again or complete the next test, for this, you must go back to step 1.

A four-step process:

- 1. Register on the online platform
- 2. Complete a structured questionnaire based on the 7 DOAS components
- 3. Receive a detailed report with scores and recommendations
- 4. Use additional resources to improve compliance with the DOAS


