Alleanze universitarie: una nuova dimensione per gli Atenei d'Europa

- Costituite nel quadro del programma Erasmus+ (prima call: 2019)
- Da 17 Alleanze (2019) a 60 Alleanze (2024), con 500 Atenei coinvolti
- ogni Alleanza, deve riunire almeno 3 diversi Paesi UE, si incentra su una tematica interdisciplinare
- obiettivo primario delle AUE (coerentemente con Erasmus+): sviluppo di una didattica comune, e mobilità di studenti, ricercatori e staff
- Tuttavia, configurandosi come vere e proprie università, le Alleanze europee sviluppano anche **ricerca**, **innovazione** (con bandi Horizon Europe) e **civic engagement**.



Alleanze universitarie europee: obiettivi

Potenziare la qualità e competitività delle Università europee nel contesto globale:

- **nuovo modello di governance** universitaria europea
- superamento dei singoli ordinamenti nazionali
- gestione condivisa di attivazione/accreditamento corsi di studio e carriere studenti
- Riconoscimento automatico titoli
- Microcrediti per curricula flessibili
- Elevata **mobilità** di studenti docenti e staff
- Integrazione con società civile, (civic university), contesto urbano, economico e sociale
- Interdisciplinarietà
- Rafforzamento dell'identità europea salvaguardando multiculturalismo e multilinguismo



Open science nelle Alleanze Universitarie Europee

- In linea con Erasmus+, OS non figura come obiettivo primario nelle
 AUE della prima call
- Tuttavia, l'avvio di progetti "**SWAFS Horizon Europe**" ha dato centralità anche ad Open Access/Open Science e Citizen Science
- Inoltre, la condivisione di strumenti, dati e risultati è divenuta di fatto
 la base di lavoro per gli atenei
- I bandi per la creazione delle alleanze più recenti (dette **"2.0"**) fanno espresso riferimento a *Open education, open science, open data, citizen science*

Ad oggi, tutte le alleanze considerano l'Open Science come il paradigma operativo di comunicazione e cooperazione.







Culture of Open Science

Research results and data must be made available as widely as possible to penetrate society, economy and politics. Beyond the development of infrastructure which enables the sharing of data and results, this culture of Open Science also depends on the capacity for researchers to communicate their research results broadly, beyond their peers, to a non-specialist public.

Survey on the role and activities of university libraries in European University Alliances

September 2024

This survey was conducted among members of the FOR-EU LIB group, an informal network of library representatives involved in European university alliances. The survey was conducted between February and March 2024. It used a public Google form with about ten closed and open-ended questions.

The survey provides important insights into the role and activities of university libraries within European university alliances. With responses from 55 universities representing 27 different alliances, the results underline the dynamic and collaborative nature of the emerging library network within each alliance.

Activities

Open science emerges as a central theme, with many libraries prioritising the integration of open science practices. This is evident from the high engagement in related initiatives. Additionally, there is a widespread effort to establish librarian networks, as reflected in the open-ended responses. These efforts aim to build robust, interconnected communities of practice to enhance knowledge sharing and collaboration across borders.

If librarians can easily engage in open science-related work within their alliance because of their almost automatic involvement, it might be beneficial to explore other networks, both within and outside of alliances, beyond open science. Libraries should not only aim to share best practice, but also focus on other library-based services and resources that support the core aims of the alliances. It is therefore important for libraries to define their role and understand the structure of the alliance in which they are participating. Participation in hybrid committees and fostering the spirit of the network are essential in this regard.


Although resource pooling is in the planning or early implementation stages for many alliances, it is a promising area for future development. The complexities involved in the legal, financial, and organisational aspects indicate that successful resource pooling could become a significant milestone for these alliances.



University Libraries: Key Players in European University Alliances

Survey on the role and activities of university libraries in European University Alliances

September 2024

The FOR-EU LIB group, a professional sub-group of the informal FOR-EU inter-alliance network, has undertaken an in-depth study of the role and activities of libraries within European university alliances under the European University Initiative (EUI). The group brings together 90 library representatives involved in 40 alliances across Europe, with the aim of sharing best practice and highlighting the crucial role of libraries in the success of the alliances. The survey, conducted between February and March 2024, gathered responses from 55 universities representing 27 different alliances.

Below are some of the key findings of the survey and a series of recommendations for libraries in European university alliances to impact and advance the goals of their alliance.

Active library participation: A key success factor.

The findings show that early involvement of libraries in alliance activities promotes more cohesive and effective collaboration. Libraries involved in projects from the outset demonstrated a greater ability to overcome challenges.

Key areas of focus: Open science and interlibrary co-operation.

The integration of open science practices has emerged as a priority for many libraries, as have the significant efforts to build strong, interconnected networks of librarians to enhance knowledge sharing and collaboration within their alliance and beyond.

However, the study also highlights ongoing challenges, particularly in terms of securing funding, navigating different institutional policies, and engaging libraries in alliance activities in an inclusive dimension. Finally, the findings suggest that expected benefits such as budget efficiency and internationalization have not yet materialized to a significant extent.

In this context, the FOR-EU LIB group proposes the following recommendations.

FOR-EU LIB Group

Recommendations for libraries in European University Alliances to impact and drive alliance goals

- 1. Encourage early involvement: Take the initiative to involve libraries from the beginning of alliance activities to ensure consistency and shared progress.
- 2. Create an organic relationship: Clearly define the role of libraries within the dynamic and collaborative structure of scholarly networks, highlighting areas where librarian expertise can enhance the functioning of the Alliance.
- 3. Adopt a bottom-up strategy: Adopt an inclusive, bottom-up management approach of the librarian working groups to facilitate wider dissemination of information and active participation in library initiatives.
- 4. Develop librarian networks: Establish robust and sustainable networks of librarians to enhance knowledge sharing and collaboration, creating interconnected communities of practice across
- 5. Build a community: Unite internal and external stakeholders in the design of the library's multifunctional services, demonstrating the library's potential as a driving force in internationalisation efforts and fostering an open culture.
- 6. Share good practice: Consistently share best practices and successful strategies among libraries of the Alliance to continuously improve and innovate library services and operations.
- 7. Promote volunteerism: Foster a culture of volunteerism through the formation of working groups and steering committees that ensure broad representation from all Alliance libraries.
- 8. Proactively address challenges: Develop comprehensive strategies for securing funding, navigating institutional policies, and engaging all libraries to overcome challenges and ensure active participation in Alliance activities.
- 9. Turn threats into opportunities: Leverage collaboration within and across Alliances to address challenges such as staff shortages and excessive library workloads.
- 10. Leverage cross-Alliance knowledge: Connect with other alliances to benefit from the expertise of their experienced groups, complementing internal knowledge with broader insights.

The informal alliance network FORum of European Universities (FOR-EU) has been in place since the start of the European Universities initiative (EUI). Alliance experts have been brought together across countries and institutions to form active communities on strategic topics, such as education cooperation, governance, research innovation dimension of alliances, or student engagement. FOR-EU has currently 20+ subgroups in place and different parallel fora where the coordinators and alliances' experts meet. Due to the increasingly large-scale nature and impact of the EUI, a merger of all FOR-EU groups is now necessary, and dedicated resources are required.
